Boroondara 'City of Harmony'

Kew is a suburb of Melbourne, Australia, 6 km East from Melbourne's Central Business District. Its local Government area is the City of Boroondara 'City of Harmony'.

Formerly a city in its own right, the cities of Kew, Hawthorn and Camberwell were amalgamated in 1994 to form the City of Boroondara. The suburb borders the Yarra River to the West and North, with Hawthorn to its South and Balwyn to its East.

Kew has grown steadily since the early Bridge Road crossing development and is now cited as one of the most prestigious suburbs in Melbourne. Kew has convenient access to public facilities and transportation. Tram routes (109, 16 and 72 along with tram route 48 - North Balwyn – Victoria Harbour Docklands) pass through the suburb and the City/Lilydale/Belgrave train line for easily access to Hawthorn and Glenferrie Stations, along with many Bus route options.

Golfers have the choice of membership at Green Acres Golf Club, Kew Golf Club (in Kew East) or at the Studley Park Par 3 Golf Course (on Studley Park Road).

Kew Football Club plays out of Victoria Park, on High Street.
