

Chapel Hill Brisbane

Chapel Hill is a suburb of Brisbane, Queensland, which is located 7 kilometers west of the Brisbane CBD. It is primarily a residential suburb, consisting of mostly detached housing and is leafy affluent area. There has been a trend towards small lot developments during the last decade. Chapel Hill is currently undergoing a 'major suburban renovation', with many of the original houses (built in the 1970s to 1990s) being demolished or renovated to make way for newer houses, or lot divisions. Currently, there are no apartment buildings in Chapel Hill. Chapel Hill has a large amount of bushland in and around the suburb including Mount Coot-tha.

Major shopping centre, Indooroopilly Shopping Centre, is only a 5 min drive from the suburb.

The Chapel (which gave the suburb its name) is a Primitive Methodist chapel built in 1875.

There are major bus services that lead through Chapel Hill; taking you to Indooroopilly shopping centre and Toowong Village, continuing onto the Brisbane CBD.

Education;

There is a state primary school, Chapel Hill State School. The nearest state high schools are at Indooroopilly and Kenmore. There are no private schools in Chapel Hill, however a large number of children living in the area travel to private high schools in Brisbane. Chapel Hill is close to the University of Queensland and as a result many academics and university students live in the suburb.
