## St. Ives Ku-ring-gai Council

*St Ives* is a suburb on the Upper North Shore of Sydney in the state of New South Wales, Australia 18 kilometres North of the Sydney Central Business District in the local government area of Ku-ring-gai Council. St Ives Chase is a separate suburb, to the North.

St Ives is a lovely area of Sydney, it was initially slow to develop due to the perceived remoteness from the city. Settlement increased in the late 1890s, when St Ives was populated by market gardeners, a small dairy, orchard workers and related industries. The suburb since the end of WW2 has seen its most rapid period of expansion and a steady growth in families moving to the area. St Ives Shopping Village is a medium sized shopping centre across from the Village Green and Skate Park.

As St Ives has no through traffic, there are rarely traffic delays in the suburb. Residents driving from St Ives will first encounter peak hour traffic trying to join or cross Killeaton Street or Mona Vale Road in St Ives. A common route to the city is via the North Shore's Eastern Arterial Road.

Buses to St Ives include Forest Coach Lines route 195 to/from Gordon railway station and route 194/594 from St Ives through St Ives to the city. North Turramurra and Bobbin Head are accessible via bush tracks in the National Park.

## Education;
