Strathmore City of Moonee Valley

Strathmore is a suburb of Melbourne, Victoria is situated approximately 11 km North-West of Melbourne's central business district.

Strathmore is part of the City of Moonee Valley local government area. Strathmore is bordered by Woodland Street to the South, Bulla Road and Essendon Airport in the West, and the Moonee Ponds Creek to the North East.

The Tullamarine Freeway divides the suburb into Northern and Southern halves. The freeway was upgraded by CityLink in the late 1990s making the City allot more accessible by Vehicles. Strathmore has its own Railway Station with is the Craigieburn railway line, this takes you directly into the City stopping at all stations along the way.

Strathmore was previously apart of Essendon, so you find everything in the Essendon area accessible including a long strip of shops and cafes along the main stretch called Mount Alexander Road.

Sport;

There is a local AFL and Cricket team in Strathmore along with a ladies Netball team.

Cyclists have easy access to the Moonee Ponds Creek Trail along the Moonee Ponds Creek.

Education;
