Wavell Heights Brisbane

Wavell Heights is a Brisbane suburb located 9 kilometers North of the Brisbane central business district. It is named after Field Marshal Lord Wavell who was the Commander-In-Chief of the Allied Forces in the Middle East during the Second World War.

Wavell Heights is surrounded by beautiful green outlooks. There are plenty of local parks around, access to the Kedron Brook Bikeway and local wetland locals call "the pond".

Shopping is convenient with Toombul, Stafford and Chermside Plaza all in easy reach. There are also local shops, cafes and restaurants at neighbouring Nundah. Access to the city and airport are also handy and travel time is less than 20mins by vehicle.

Social / Sport;

Getting involved in something local won't be a problem in Wavell Heights, including a Karate club, girl guides, scouts and a lapidary club.

The Society also manages a public tennis court and a community centre, consisting of a hall with two floors, stages and kitchen facilities.

Education;

Wavell Heights includes a Kindergarten, one public primary school, Wavell Heights State School and one public secondary school, Wavell State High School. These are the largest public schools in Brisbane's northern suburbs.
